Sign Up Now for Water-Smart School Program in May *RWA, Sacramento Bee Team Up to Offer Free Classroom Materials*

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – Water conservation doesn't have to be a dry subject. The Regional Water Authority (RWA) and the *Sacramento Bee* have created a fun and exciting way to bring water-related educational tools to area classrooms this May.

Part of the popular Newspaper in Education (N.I.E.) program, the "Be Water Smart" project is designed to help students understand the importance of water in their daily lives. It is a great classroom unit for May, which is recognized as Water Awareness Month in California.

"Be Water Smart" is suggested for grades K-8. There is no cost to classroom teachers. RWA and its participating member agencies sponsor all participation costs for local schools. Teachers who enroll in the project will receive:

- **Student supplements** that tell the never-ending story of the water cycle and introduce students to ecology through math, science and language arts. A class set of supplements will be delivered to schools May 2.
- **Teaching materials**, including a "Be Water Smart" teacher guide with practical applications in language arts, social studies and science. A poster / map called "California Waterways" will also be provided for the classroom bulletin board.

- **A special N.I.E. subscription** that includes a class set of the *Sacramento Bee* delivered to the school on four consecutive Tuesdays beginning May 2. Teaching materials provide 12 newspaper-based lessons for grades K-4, and 15 lessons for grades 5-8.

Students in participating classrooms will also have the chance to win prizes, including a visit from water conservation mascot Mr. Leaky.
