

RESOLUTION NO. 2004-04

**A RESOLUTION OF THE SACRAMENTO GROUNDWATER AUTHORITY
TO ACKNOWLEDGE AND COMMEND
THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS
FOR ITS SUPPORT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF
A DATA MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AND
A GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN**

The Board of Directors of the Sacramento Groundwater Authority (“SGA”) does hereby find that:

WHEREAS, the SGA was formed under the Joint Exercise of Powers Act (Chapter 5 of Division 7 of Title 1 of the California Government Code) on August 11, 1998 by the Cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, and Sacramento, and the County of Sacramento; and

WHEREAS, the SGA was created for the purposes of protecting, preserving, and enhancing, for current and future beneficial uses, the groundwater resources in the groundwater basin underlying Sacramento County north of the American River; and

WHEREAS, the SGA and its representative members had a need to develop a Data Management System (DMS) to serve as a tool to help ensure that the region’s groundwater resources, relied upon by more than 500,000 residents, are adequately protected and sustained; and

WHEREAS, the SGA and its representative members are charged with development of a Groundwater Management Plan (GMP) to ensure protection and sustainability of the groundwater resources consistent with the Sacramento Water Forum Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), through the authorization provided by PL 104-303 (Water Resources Development Act 1996), Section 503, paragraph (d)(7), entered into a mutually beneficial partnership to develop a DMS and GMP; and

WHEREAS, the partnership resources coupled with excellent project management services provided by the Corps resulted in successful DMS and GMP project completion in a timely fashion and within specified budgets.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that, the SGA Board of Directors hereby acknowledges and commends the United States Army Corps of Engineers for its generous support and project management in the successful completion of a Data Management System and Groundwater Management Plan, which will serve as valuable tools in SGA’s efforts to manage the north-area groundwater basin for the benefit of current and future generations.
